A message from the
Mayor



The accessibility of beautiful parks and the availability of plentiful recreational opportunities for residents of all ages continue to be a top priority for my administration. In 2012 we celebrated the grand opening of the new Colombo Park on Pearl Road near Stumph Road. We also announced the awarding of a grant for the construction of the Parma Heights – Big Creek Connector Trail, linking the Greenbrier Commons to the Cleveland Metroparks via an 85 ft. bridge. This remarkable project will get underway in the spring with an anticipated completion by early fall.

This year, I am happy to report that we have signed an agreement with the City of Brook Park granting our residents access to their Recreation Center, conveniently located on Holland Road. The partnerships we have forged with the cities of Brook Park and Brooklyn mean our residents will now have access to two great recreation facilities. Details on both facilities can be found in this brochure.

As you will see in the following pages, under the leadership of Director Tom Moran, our Recreation Department has been working hard to provide a variety of programs and activities to residents of all ages. The following are samples of the various recreational opportunities we provide:

- Our partnership with the cities of Brooklyn and Brook Park to access their recreation centers
- Colombo Park on Pearl Road
- The walking trail and pavilion at Radlick Park
- Even more flag football, soccer and baseball/softball/t-ball teams
- The annual Gazebo Gallop and Kids Dash activities to be held Sunday, August 4th

Although not featured in these pages, the Cassidy Theatre remains in the heart of our Greenbrier Commons and continues to offer “Great Theatre Close To Home” with various opportunities for community participation. As the Recreation Director of Parma Heights, it is my pleasure to bring you up to date on all the recreational activities in our town. I am very proud of the variety of excellent programs the city has to offer and I invite you to take some time to page through this brochure and see for yourself. You might even want to mark your calendar with important dates, like baseball or soccer registration times, or even the dates of our 2013 Weekend In The Commons (August 10 and 11).

This year, a big change is coming to the largest of our parks: the construction of the Parma Heights—Big Creek Connector Trail in the Greenbrier Commons. This project is a result of a collaborative effort between the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Recreational Trail Program through a grant awarded to the Cleveland Metroparks and the Cuyahoga County Competitive Municipal Grant Program through a Community Development Block Grant awarded to the city. Completely funded by grant dollars, the \$324,000 project will create a new trail that will link our existing trail entrance near Halcyon behind the NEO Soccer facility to an 85-foot bridge that will span the Big Creek and allow residents direct access to the Big Creek Parkway. A small, side trail will lead to our multipurpose trail behind the Cassidy Theatre.

Please use the inside back cover of this brochure as a reference for locations of the many recreation areas and facilities available to our residents and make it a point to take advantage of all our town has to offer. The City of Parma Heights prides itself on offering the best in recreational activities in the area. Don't hesitate to go out and enjoy them!





Parma Heights/Brooklyn Recreation Partnership

On June 1, 2011, Parma Heights Mayor Michael P. Byrne and Brooklyn Mayor Richard Balbier formed a community partnership that allows Parma Heights residents to take advantage of the John M. Coyne Recreation Center in Brooklyn at a discounted rate. Under the plan, Parma Heights residents pay program fees that are slightly higher than Brooklyn residents pay, but less than non-residents are assessed. Parma Heights residents have access to all Brooklyn Recreation amenities not duplicated in Parma Heights.

Luckily for residents of Parma Heights that leaves a wide array of recreation options ranging from the indoor pool with whirlpool, steam room and sauna; ice-skating facility, clubs and competitions; a variety of classes and even a cardiovascular exercise room.

The Buddy Program is a special recreation program for special needs children and their families interested in the sports of baseball, basketball, swimming and ice-skating. Under the program, the play of the sport is adapted to the needs of the particular child and participating family members.

Brooklyn Recreation offers a “Silver Sneakers” fitness program for Parma Heights residents that are 65 or older. Some health plans include this as part of their benefits.

Parma Heights/Brook Park Recreation Partnership

Parma Heights Mayor Michael P. Byrne and Brook Park Mayor Mark J. Elliott have formed a community partnership that will positively affect both cities. Parma Heights residents will be able to take advantage of the John A. Poloyne Community Center in Brook Park at discounted rates and will have access to all Brook Park amenities not duplicated in Parma Heights.

The original Recreation facility was built in 1972 and underwent a renovation in 1996 transforming the existing building and grounds into a 125,000 square foot facility that boasts:

- Two gymnasiums
- Four lane elevated walk/run track that is handicap accessible
- 25 yard, seven lane competition swimming pool
- Diving well with two 1 meter boards
- Steam/Sauna/Whirlpool (Separate in locker rooms)
- Two private family changing rooms
- Cybex Weight Circuit & free weights
- Cardiovascular equipment
- Multi-purpose room with stage
- Various meeting rooms
- Game room
- Snack bar

Their center serves people of all ages and is a functional and fun place for the whole family. They offer an array of great activities and we encourage you to participate in the many programs Brook Park has to offer.

The Parma Heights Swim Team is looking for swimmers who want to have fun this summer while learning and improving their competitive swimming skills. The butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke, and freestyle swim strokes, as well as flip turns, are taught and practiced.

As a member of the Cuyahoga Valley Swim League, we compete against teams from Brecksville, Forest Hills, Independence, Parma, and Greenwood Village. Our season includes 10 dual meets against individual teams and a season championship against all teams in the league.

In order to fit your summer schedule, we provide practice time twice a day at the Parma Heights Water Park. A Parma Heights pool pass is required for each swimmer as well as a \$30.00 team registration fee.

Registration will be held on the first and second Saturday mornings in May at Parma Heights City Hall, between 10:00 AM and 12:00 PM. Be sure to look for the Swim Team table when signing up for swimming or tennis lessons.

A \$30.00 registration fee for residents (\$50.00 for non-residents) provides each boy and girl with shirt and cap, equipment and overall excellent playing fields. **A LATE FEE** of \$10.00 for residents and non-residents will be collected for registrations after March 9, 2013.

Proof of residency will be required at the time of registration.

UMPIRES: For all games, umpires are supplied by the Parma Heights Umpires Association. You must be 12 years or older to be a Junior Umpire for our Youth Leagues and 18 years or older to be a Senior Umpire in our Adult Leagues. Junior and Senior Umpires will be **PAID A FEE** for each game they officiate. Training classes will begin in late winter for the Senior Umpires and early spring for the Junior Umpires. Resident and non-residents are welcome. Please call 440-884-9600 extension 37 if you are interested in attending these classes and becoming an umpire.

Registration will be held on Wednesday, June 5th and Tuesday, June 11th from 4:30-6:30 PM at City Hall. The fee is \$40, we accept cash or check only, no debit/credit cards. A current utility bill and participant's most current report card will be required upon registration.

Practice will take place in August with games being played Saturday mornings in September & October. 2nd and 3rd grades will play at N.E.O. Soccer, 4th and 5th grades will play at the Reservoir fields.

Parma Heights was the first city in Ohio to pass a bond issue for building a library. In 1960, a \$160,000.00 bond issue made possible the construction of a library, a branch of the Cuyahoga County Public Library System, for the convenience of our residents. In 1987 another bond issue was passed, and the library was totally remodeled in order to double the floor space, provide carpeting, computerization, new meeting rooms, and other modern facilities.
