

PRESENT: Council President Gallo, Council Members Everett, McCall, Danczak, Stavole and Clerk of Council Bohdan

ALSO PRESENT: Mayor Byrne, Law Director Pokorny, Director of Finance/Personnel Hickey, Director of Public Service Patten, Engineer Neff, Director of Community and Economic Development Sebes and Assistant Law Director Schneider.

ABSENT: Councilman Verdile

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m.

The 1st item on the agenda is the salt program with ODOT for the 2019-2020 winter season. Director Patten explained that this was a housekeeping piece of legislation. This allows the City to participate in the ODOT contracts for the state purchase for equipment, salt, etc. Director Patten asked Council to consider one reading at the next Council meeting.

Councilman Stavole asked how we did with salt this year. Director Patten replied that we have 600 tons left from this year.

Council President Gallo asked Council if they had objections to one reading, there were none.

Item #2 on the agenda is the Nathan Hale Stormwater Basin Project. Engineer Neff explained Planning Commission reviewed this project and referred it back to Council with their approval. Engineer Neff stated that what the City is proposing to help alleviate flooding is a large stormwater basin at Nathan Hale Park. It will have 35-acre feet of storage. The old concession stand with bathrooms will be demolished. As the basin is created, the dirt from the basin will create a large mound in that area and we will fence it all in. Some of the fields will be raised with the dirt to balance the park. Engineer Neff stated that the City could use their matching funds from the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District stormwater fees to rebuild the bathrooms.

Engineer Neff continued to explain the whole park would be shut down after the spring soccer leagues finish around May 18th. The project will be completed this year. Engineer Neff explained that the Planning Commission needed to review this project and refer it back to Council for their review because we are changing the use of a public park. There will be soccer fields put back in place when the project is completed.

Councilman Stavole asked if electric would go back into the building that will be constructed with the bathrooms. Engineer Neff replied it would, he stated that sanitary sewers tied in, hot and cold running water and electricity. The building will not be heated for the season; it will be closed after the season.

Councilman McCall asked if the baseball diamonds would be replaced, Engineer Neff replied that there would not be baseball fields at this location. Engineer Neff stated that they are looking at other options for fields, one being at the back of the Reservoir for field expansion. Engineer Neff stated that the John Litten Ballfield, which is currently at Nathan Hale, be replaced at a field at Stroud Park.

Councilman McCall asked how long the project would take, Engineer Neff from starting after the soccer season ends it will go through to the fall, with the digging of the basin and replanting of the grass.

Councilman McCall asked if there is any project or place in the City that some of the dirt can be used, Engineer Neff replied the Reservoir. He stated in order to make ballfields; fill will need to be brought in. Engineer Neff stated that the dirt could be sold if there is a project nearby and clean fill is needed. Councilman McCall asked where is

the dirt going to be located compared to where properties are and are the residents going to have mudslides in their yards.

Engineer Neff replied that mudslides would not happen. The whole mound will drain all the way into the basin. There will be about 250 acres draining into the basin, it will fill in the pond and discharge into a storm sewer back out into the system. This should relieve the sewers that are running out to Parma Park and the sewers that are running out to Orchard.

Councilman McCall asked if there was a cost to treating the water that is sitting there. Engineer Neff replied the City is not required to do pre-treatment. During heavy rain events and the water is diverted into the basin it slows it down, which reduces downstream sediments. Councilman McCall asked how high the fence would be, Engineer Neff replied 6 feet galvanized fence.

Councilwoman Koch who oversees this basin, Engineer Neff stated that part of the City's MS4 permit, the City is required to maintain all of their stormwater. Engineer Neff continued that this is done with the assistance of the Department of Public Service's Sanitary & Storm Division, the NEORSO Soil & Water District and the Board of Health.

Item #2 and #3 are the agreements for resurfacing York Road and W. 130th Street. Engineer Neff explained W. 130th is going to be repaved from just west of Pleasant Valley Road all the way to Snow Road. Originally, the project was scheduled to be done in 2020 because Parma wanted to do sewer work. The project has been moved up to 2019 and the cost to the City is approximately \$200,000. The Federal government will pick up 80% of the project, Cuyahoga County Issue 2 money will pick up 10% and the remaining 10% picked up by the adjacent cities. Engineer Neff is more comfortable if the City budgeted \$225,000 for the project. Engineer Neff asked Council to pass in one reading at the next Council meeting. He stated the project would start around of the end of May 2019 and be completed before October of 2020.

Council President Gallo asked if Council had any objections to one reading, there were none.

Engineer Neff stated that the York Road project is scheduled for 2020. The Engineer asked Council to consider this in one reading.

Councilman Stavole asked how deep they were going, Engineer Neff replied they would be taking 3" of asphalt off, all the way down to the concrete base, repair the concrete that is broken underneath, do catch basin adjustments, manhole adjustments and then resurface.

With no further items for discussion the meetings was adjourned at 8:04 p.m.
