
2018 ANNUAL REPORT



IN 2018, THE PARMA HEIGHTS POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS ABLE TO CONTINUE OUR PROGRESS TOWARD MEETING OUR TRAINING GOALS. THE BUDGET ALLOWED FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION, FIELD TRAINING TWO NEWLY APPOINTED POLICE OFFICERS AND ALLOWED FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION AND ADVANCED TRAINING FOR VETERAN OFFICERS.

NOTABLE AMONG THIS ADVANCED TRAINING WAS ACTING IN CONCERT WITH THE PARMA POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THE PARMA HEIGHTS AND PARMA FIRE DEPARTMENTS IN EXPANDED ACTIVE SHOOTER TRAINING AND FIRST AID/SELF AID CARE.






















THE PARMA HEIGHTS POLICE 'POLICE AND CITIZENS TOGETHER' (P.A.C.T.) UNIT WAS STARTED IN LATE 2017 BY A PATROLMAN WHO SAW A NEED FOR MORE DEVELOPED RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THE CITIZENS WHICH WE SERVE. THE P.A.C.T. UNIT WORKS ON A MULTI-PILLAR APPROACH, THE YOUTH GROUP, TOWN HALLS, AND SENIOR PROGRAMMING.

THE YOUTH GROUP IS FOR ANY YOUTH WHO LIVES OR ATTENDS SCHOOL IN THE CITY AGES 12 TO 17. WE MEET TWICE A MONTH WITH EACH MEETING HAVING A DIFFERENT FOCUS. ONE MEETING EACH MONTH IS "ISSUE-BASED" AND WE ALLOW THE YOUTH TO BRING FORWARD ISSUES THAT THEY WANT TO FOCUS ON. THE SECOND MEETING EACH MONTH IS AN "EXPERIENCE-BASED" MEETING WHERE WE AIM TO BUILD PERSONALIZED RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN OFFICERS AND THE COMMUNITY'S YOUTH. THE GROUP HAS BEEN GROWING IN NUMBER SINCE ITS INCEPTION AND HAS BEEN FOUND TO BE EXTREMELY EFFECTIVE.

THE TOWN HALL MEETINGS ARE CHANCES FOR AN OPEN FORUM DISCUSSION BETWEEN RESIDENTS AND THE GOVERNMENT WHICH SERVES THEM. WE HAVE HAD MEMBERS OF THE DEPARTMENT'S ADMINISTRATION AS WELL AS CITY HALL OFFICIALS AT THESE EVENTS IN AN EFFORT TO ACHIEVE TRANSPARENCY FOR OUR RESIDENTS. WE ALSO BRING IN COMMUNITY RESOURCES SO THAT RESIDENTS ARE AWARE OF WHAT IS AVAILABLE TO THEM.

THE SENIOR PROGRAMMING HAS BEEN DONE IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE PARMA HEIGHTS SENIOR CENTER AS WELL AS INDEPENDENCE PLACE APARTMENTS. WE BRING OFFICERS AND DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL INTO THESE VENUES SO THAT THE SENIOR CITIZENS ARE CONTINUALLY UPDATED ON ISSUES THAT MAY AFFECT THEM AND THE RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO THEM WHILE OFFERING COMPANIONSHIP.

IN ADDITION TO THESE CORE PROGRAMS, WE HAVE OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO EACH ZONE WITHIN THE CITY TO PROVIDE A MORE INDIVIDUALIZED APPROACH TO COMMUNITY POLICING WHEN DEALING WITH ISSUES THAT DO NOT REQUIRE AN IMMEDIATE POLICE RESPONSE.

P.A.C.T. UNIT MEMBERS HAVE ALSO SPOKEN AT VARIOUS HIGH SCHOOL AND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL EVENTS, PARTICIPATED IN PARMA HEIGHTS HISTORICAL SOCIETY EVENTS, ATTENDED TOUCH-A-TRUCK AND KIDS IN THE COMMONS, SPOKEN TO SPECIAL NEEDS POPULATIONS AND HOSTED COFFEE WITH A COP AT LOCAL COFFEE ESTABLISHMENTS. THESE FEW EVENTS ARE ONLY A SMALL PORTION OF THE WORK THE MEMBERS OF THIS UNIT HAVE ACHIEVED OVER THE PAST YEAR.

WITH THE LOSS OF GRANT FUNDING SUMMER OF 2018, WE HELD OUR FIRST HALLOWEEN HURRAH FUNDRAISER IN AN EFFORT TO KEEP THESE PROGRAMS FUNCTIONING. THE FUNDRAISER WAS A LARGE SUCCESS DUE IN LARGE PART TO THE VOLUNTEER EFFORTS OF THE YOUTH GROUP PARTICIPANTS, BUSINESSES WITHIN THE CITY, MEMBERS OF THIS DEPARTMENT AS WELL AS COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS. THE HALLOWEEN HURRAH FUNDRAISER IS SOMETHING WE HOPE TO CONTINUE IN COMING YEARS.
