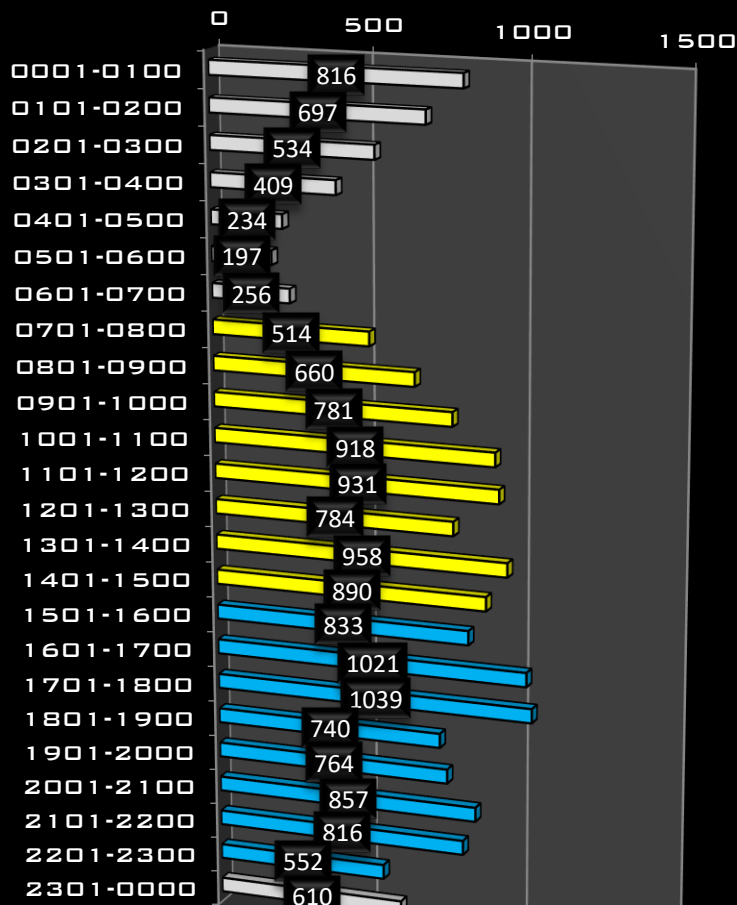

## FIREARMS TRAINING UNIT



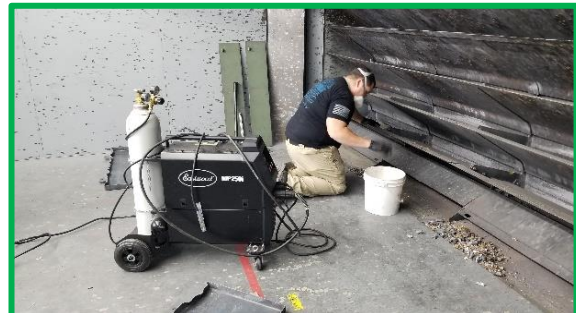
FOR THE YEAR 2020, OUR IN-HOUSE FIREARMS TRAINING PROGRAM AND THE SGT. BENNETT FIREARMS TRAINING RANGE SAW SOME CONTINUING CHANGES, UPDATES, AND IMPROVEMENTS. WE BEGAN THE YEAR IN JANUARY BY CONDUCTING ANNUAL OPOTA QUALIFICATIONS FOR A MAJORITY OF THE DEPARTMENT ON THE BASIC OPOTA STANDARDS IN DUTY HANDGUN AND SHOTGUN. THESE BASIC QUALIFICATIONS ARE MANDATED BY OPOTA FOR ALL POLICE DEPARTMENTS IN OHIO.

AS THE YEAR PROGRESSED, WE CONTINUED WITH ANNUAL QUALIFICATIONS AND ADDED OUR DEPARTMENT MANDATED PATROL RIFLE QUALIFICATIONS AS WELL. ALTHOUGH NOT REQUIRED BY OPOTA, WE HAVE INSTITUTED THIS AS AN ANNUAL REQUIREMENT FOR ALL OFFICERS SO THAT EACH IS FAMILIAR WITH THE SAFE OPERATION AND EMPLOYMENT OF THE PATROL RIFLE PLATFORM WHETHER THEY DEPLOY THEM OR NOT.

CONTINUING THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, ADDITIONAL FIREARMS AND USE OF FORCE TRAINING FOR OUR OFFICERS WAS CONDUCTED ON A REGULAR BASIS. THIS TRAINING INCLUDED WORK ON TARGET DISCRIMINATION AND IDENTIFICATION (UTILIZING ARMED "SHOOT"/UNARMED "DON'T SHOOT" PHOTO REALISTIC TARGETS), TRANSITION DRILLS, LOW LEVEL LIGHT OPERATIONS, AND NUMEROUS ADDITIONAL SKILLSETS. THE DEPARTMENT USE OF FORCE (UOF) POLICY WAS REVIEWED IN ADDITION TO CASE LAW AS RELATED TO USE OF FORCE AND DEADLY FORCE. OFFICERS VIEWED VIDEOS OF NATIONAL OFFICER INVOLVED INCIDENTS INVOLVING USE OF FORCE, AND REGULAR DISCUSSIONS WERE HELD ON INCIDENTS AND TACTICS FOUND IN THOSE VIDEOS AND THE GENERAL STATE OF POLICING IN THE UNITED STATES.

IN MID-FEBURARY, AND AGAIN IN OCTOBER, THE FIREARMS TRAINING UNIT (FTU) PROVIDED DEPARTMENT OFFICERS WITH MEMBER SPECIFIC PATROL RIFLE TRAINING. THIS WAS CONDUCTED AS TWO SEPARATE TWO DAY IN-HOUSE COURSES AND WAS GIVEN AS A PARTIAL CLASSROOM AND LIVE-FIRE COURSE. OFFICERS WERE EXPLAINED THE WHAT, WHY, AND HOW OF PATROL RIFLE DEPLOYMENT.

DURING THE PATROL RIFLE TRAINING IN FEBRUARY, THE FTU IDENTIFIED THAT THE FIREARMS RANGE WAS IN NEED OF ANNUAL CLEANING AND REMOVAL OF THE BULLET LEAD CONTAINED IN THE BULLET TRAP. THIS IS THE BUILD UP OF BULLETS FIRED DURING ALL DEPARTMENTAL FIREARMS TRAINING, SEB TRAINING HELD AT OUR RANGE, AND OUTSIDE AGENCY TRAINING CONDUCTED IN COOPERATION AT OUR RANGE. SGT. LINDH CONTACTED MT2 FIRING RANGE SERVICES OUT OF COLORADO. THEIR INDUSTRY BEST PRACTICES, ALONG WITH HIGH DOLLAR INSURANCE POLICY AND STRICT OSHA AND EPA COMPLIANCE MAKE THEM THE BEST IN THE BUSINESS. AFTER CONSULTING WITH MT2, THE COMPANY WAS CONTRACTED TO COME AND CONDUCT CLEANING AND LEAD ABATEMENT OF OUR RANGE. THIS SHOULD BE AN ANNUAL PROJECT, BUT HAD NOT BEEN COMPLETED SINCE THE SUMMER OF 2018 DUE TO BUDGET RESTRICTIONS. AT THE END OF APRIL, MT2 CAME TO OUR FACILITY AND CONDUCTED THE CLEANING. 50% OF THIS COST WAS SHARED WITH OUR DEPARTMENT BY THE WESTERN REGION OF SEB SWAT. THE COMPANY WAS HERE A TOTAL OF TWO DAYS AND CONDUCTED A COMPLETE CLEANING OF THE RANGE. THE LEAD WASTE (NOW HAZARDOUS MATERIAL) WAS THEN COLLECTED AND DISPOSED OF PER EPA REQUIREMENTS, AND THE DEPARTMENT RECEIVED A CERTIFICATE FROM MT2 DOCUMENTING THE PROPER LEAD REMOVAL.







## FIREARMS TRAINING UNIT



IN MAY 2020 THE FIREARMS TRAINING UNIT CONDUCTED A SERIALIZED INVENTORY OF ALL DEPARTMENTAL WEAPONS. ALL WEAPONS WERE ACCOUNTED FOR AND THEIR LOCATIONS AND DEPLOYMENT VEHICLES WERE RECORDED. THE FTU WEAPON CLEANING TEAM CLEANED AND INSPECTED OUR DEPARTMENT OWNED PATROL RIFLES, SUBMACHINE GUNS, AND SHOTGUNS. ANY ISSUES WERE IDENTIFIED AND RECTIFIED AS NEEDED AND AS POSSIBLE.

IN AUGUST THE DEPARTMENTAL PATROL RIFLES WERE RE-ZEROED (SIGHTS RE-CONFIRMED) AND THE RED DOT OPTICS THAT WE RECEIVED FROM THE US GOVERNMENT IN LATE 2019 WERE MOUNTED TO THE PATROL RIFLES AND ZEROED (SIGHTED IN) FOR EACH RIFLE USING DUTY AMMUNITION. THESE OPTICS GIVE OUR OFFICERS THE ABILITY TO QUICKLY ATTAIN A SIGHT PICTURE ON A TARGET WHEN DEPLOYED BY AN OFFICER. RECEIVING THESE OPTICS FROM THE US GOVERNMENT'S 1033 PROGRAM SAVED THE CITY NEARLY \$7000.

AGAIN THROUGHOUT THIS YEAR, OUR DEPARTMENT WAS ABLE TO ASSIST OUTSIDE AGENCIES WITH THE USE OF OUR FIREARMS RANGE. AGENCIES LIKE SEB, THE ATF, OIU, BEREA PD, OLMSTED FALLS PD, AND MORE WERE ABLE TO CONDUCT FIREARMS TRAINING IN OUR RANGE DUE TO THE OUTSTANDING RELATIONSHIPS THE FTU HAS FOSTERED WITH OTHER AGENCIES.

IN BEGINNING OF DECEMBER WE HOSTED A FOUR DAY ARMORERS COURSE AT THE PARMA ARMORY. THE COURSE WAS SPLIT BETWEEN A TWO DAY AR-15 ARMORERS COURSE AND A TWO DAY SHOTGUN ARMORERS COURSE. SEVERAL OF OUR OFFICERS ATTENDED AND WERE CERTIFIED AS ARMORERS TO WORK ON AND REPAIR OUR FIREARMS. BECAUSE OF THE LESSONS LEARNED IN THESE COURSES, A SCHEDULE WAS PUT IN PLACE TO ENSURE THAT EACH LONG WEAPON (PATROL RIFLES AND SHOTGUNS) IS BEING CLEANED ON A REGULAR SCHEDULE, AND A PLAN TO INSTITUTE AN ANNUAL INSPECTION OF ALL SHOTGUNS AND PATROL RIFLES TO ENSURE THE MAINTENANCE OF THESE WEAPONS IS ONGOING.

IN MID-DECEMBER, MEMBERS OF THE FTU CONDUCTED A FULL MAINTENANCE DAY IN THE SGT. BENNETT FIREARMS RANGE CONDUCTING CLEANING, MAINTENANCE, AND AN INSPECTION OF THE RANGE. THE BACKSTOP WAS INSPECTED AND NEEDED REPAIRS WERE MADE BY PTL. FISCHER IN SEVERAL SPOTS THAT REQUIRED IMMEDIATE ATTENTION. DURING THIS MAINTENANCE DAY, SEVERAL HUNDRED POUNDS OF LEAD WERE REMOVED FROM THE BULLET TRAPS IN HOPES OF MINIMIZING THE NEED FOR PROFESSIONAL CLEANING.

THE FTU FINISHED THE YEAR WITH COMPLETING ANY REMAINING OPOTA AND IN-HOUSE QUALIFICATIONS. SUPPLY AND EQUIPMENT CHECKS WERE CONDUCTED TO IDENTIFY NEEDED ITEMS GOING INTO 2021 AND DISCUSSIONS WERE HELD TO IDENTIFY TRENDS IN FIREARMS TRAINING THAT CAN BE ADDRESSED, REVIEWED, AND POTENTIALLY IMPLEMENTED TO CONTINUE WITH BEST PRACTICE STANDARDS EMPLOYED THROUGHOUT THE YEAR.

A TRAINING PLAN HAS BEEN DISCUSSED AND IS IN PLACE FOR 2021, WITH SUPPORT OF CHIEF SCHARSCHMIDT, TO PLAN AND CONDUCT HANDGUN TRAINING IN A SIMILAR FASHION TO THE RIFLE TRAINING CONDUCTED IN 2020. THIS WOULD BE A ONE-DAY CLASS AND BE GIVEN TO ALL OFFICERS.

THE PARMA HEIGHTS POLICE DEPARTMENT TRAINING IS CRUCIALLY IMPORTANT IN THE EVER-CHANGING LAW ENFORCEMENT FIELD. OUR TRAINING PROGRAM IS A BLEND OF CLASS SEMINARS, INHOUSE INSTRUCTION AND ON-LINE COURSES; WHICH ALL MEET THE OFFICERS' TRAINING NEEDS. OUR GOAL OF OUR TRAINING PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE OUR STAFF WITH THE KNOWLEDGE TO PERFORM THEIR DUTIES WITH CONFIDENCE. IN MARCH 2020, THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC DRAMATICALLY CHANGED THE WAY WE TRAIN OUR OFFICERS, MANY CLASSES AND SEMINARS WERE EITHER CANCELLED OR SWITCHED TO ON-LINE TRAINING. OUR DEPARTMENT ADJUSTED ACCORDINGLY WITH THE CONTINUED GOAL TO KEEP OUR OFFICERS HIGHLY TRAINED. TRAINING DIRECTLY AFFECTS THE SUCCESS OF SERVICE PROVIDED TO THE COMMUNITY AND LIABILITY PLACED ON THE CITY. BELOW IS A SUMMARY OF TRAINING THAT OUR OFFICERS AND STAFF MEMBERS COMPLETED:

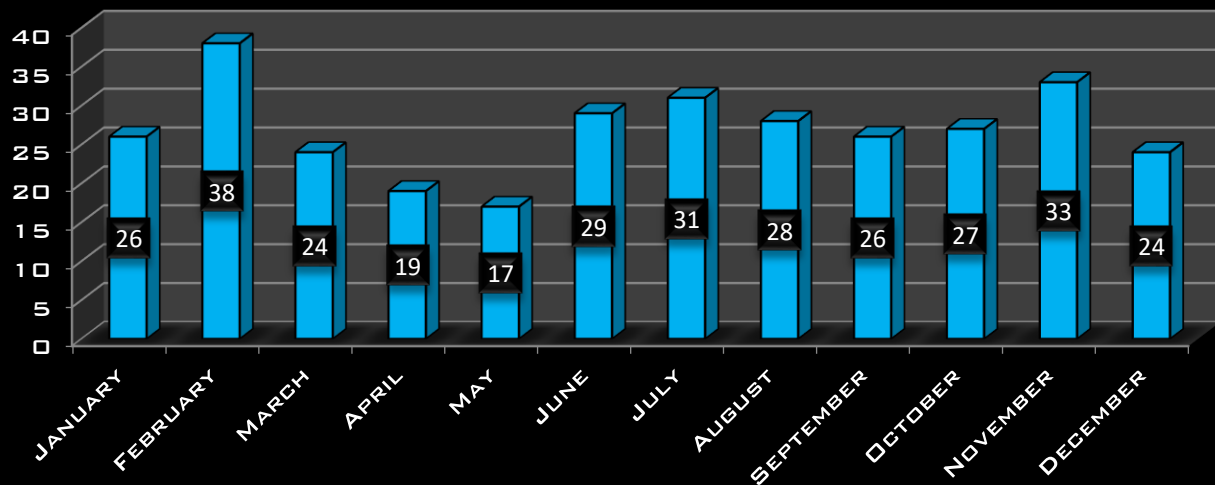

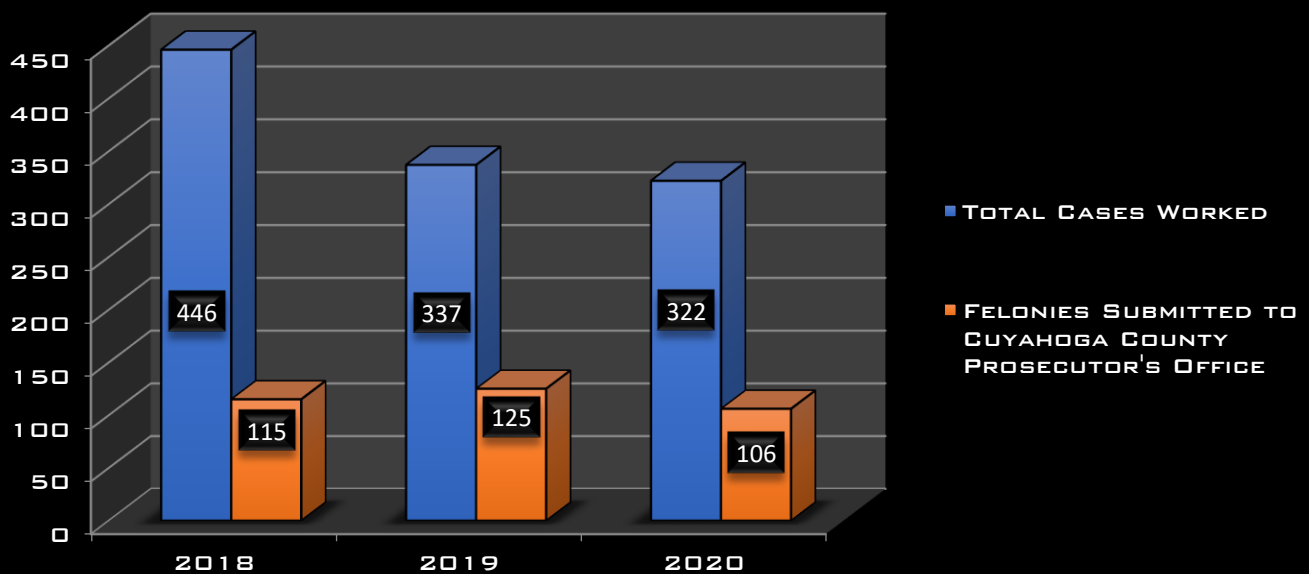

## SOUTHWEST ENFORCEMENT BUREAU



THE WEST REGION S.W.A.T. TEAM RESPONDED TO 10 OF THE 11 CITIES/TOWNSHIPS WITHIN THE REGION THIS YEAR. WE RESPONDED TO THE CITY OF CLEVELAND AS MUTUAL-AID TO CLEVELAND'S SWAT UNIT 3 TIMES FOR CIVIL UNREST CALLS, AND 2 OTHER TIMES TO ASSIST WITH THE PRESIDENTIAL DEBATES. THE WEST REGION ALSO ASSISTED THE EAST AND CENTRAL REGIONS OF SEB S.W.A.T. ON 2 CALLS FOR SERVICE.

NINE OF THE 26 CALLS FOR SERVICE, OR 35% OF THE TOTAL CALLS WERE FOR BARRICADED SUBJECTS.

FOUR CALLS, OR 15%, WERE FOR SEARCH OR ARREST WARRANT SERVICE.

FIVE CALLS, OR 19%, WERE FOR MANPOWER ISSUES RELATED TO PROTESTS.

TWO CALLS, OR 8%, WERE FOR MANPOWER ISSUES RELATED TO SEARCHES FOR MISSING JUVENILES.

FIVE CALLS, OR 19%, WERE MUTUAL-AID CALLS OUTSIDE OF SEB CITIES.

ONE CALL, OR 4%, WAS FOR A PROTECTION DETAIL DURING A FALLEN OFFICER'S FUNERAL.

OF THE 9 CALLS FOR BARRICADED SUBJECTS, GAS DEPLOYMENT WAS USED AS A TACTICAL INTERVENTION BY THE WEST REGION ON 3 OF THE CALLS. THE WEST REGION ALSO ASSISTED THE CENTRAL REGION ON A BARRICADE CALL FOR SERVICE WHERE GAS DEPLOYMENT OCCURRED. OVERALL, 40% OF THE BARRICADE CALLS WERE RESOLVED WITH THE USE OF GAS. NINE OF THE 10 BARRICADE CALLS RESULTED IN ARRESTS. ONE CALL FOR A BARRICADED SUBJECT RESULTED IN THE USE OF DEADLY FORCE.

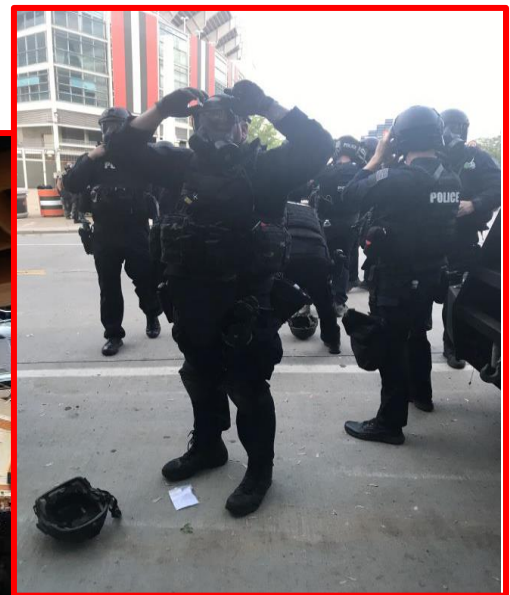

IS COMPRISED OF OFFICERS SEPARATE FROM SEB S.W.A.T., BUT CAN OPERATE IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE S.W.A.T. UNIT.

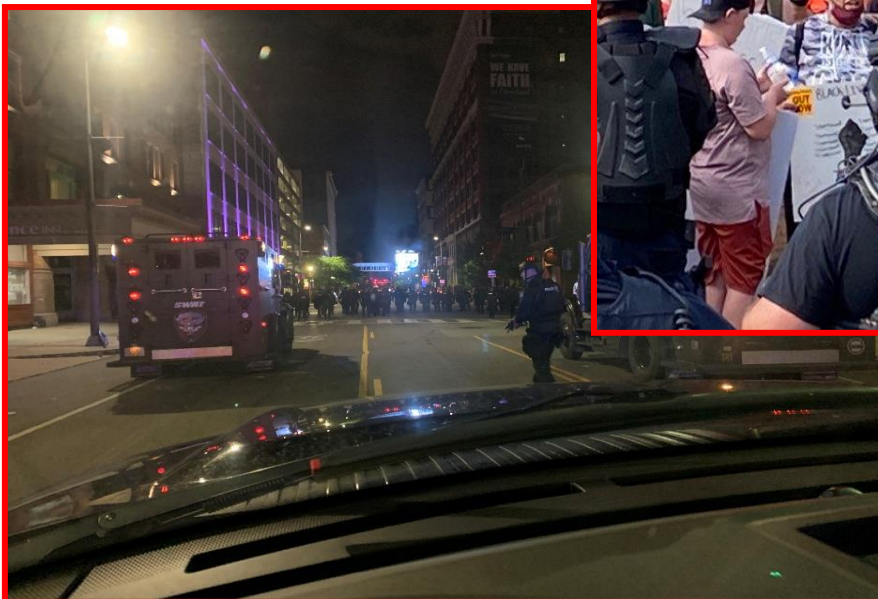

THE UNIT ALSO HAS 2 MEMBERS CERTIFIED TO DO EDR (ELECTRONIC DATA RECORDER AKA "BLACK BOX") DOWNLOADS AND 1 MEMBER CERTIFIED TO INTERPRET THE REPORTS GENERATED FROM THE EDR DOWNLOAD. ALL CRASH REPORTS ARE PEER REVIEWED BY ANOTHER MEMBER CITY AND THE UNIT'S REPORTS HAVE BECOME UNIFORM.

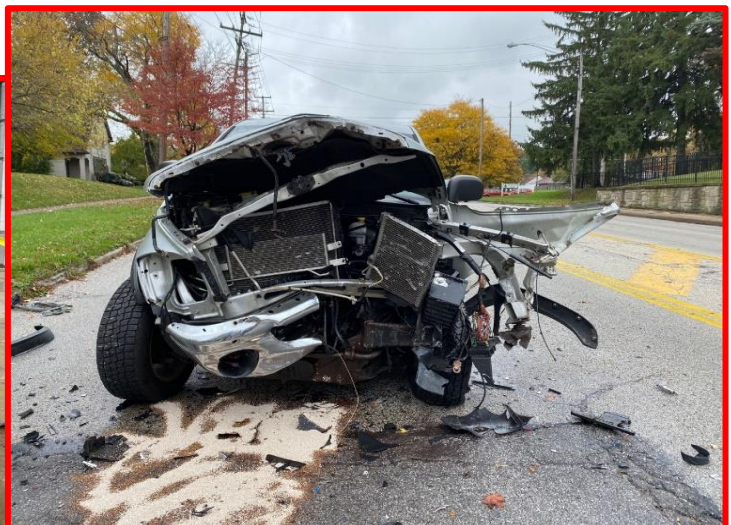
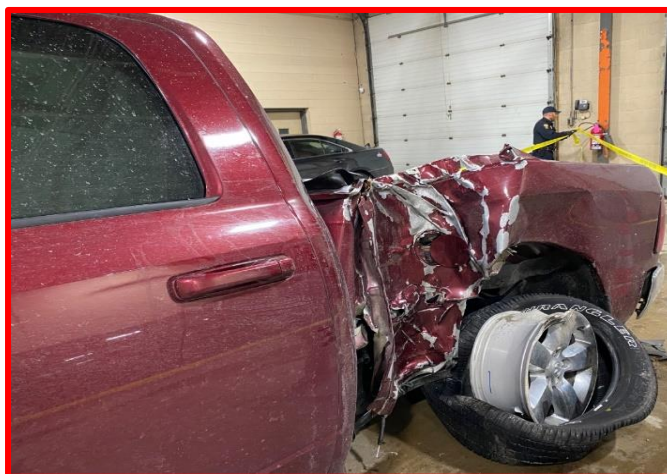

CALLOUT PROCEDURES WERE ADJUSTED IN 2020 TO MINIMIZE OVERTIME EXPENDITURES AND ENSURE MEMBERS FROM ALL CITIES ARE USED EQUALLY FOR INVESTIGATIONS. NEW CITIES WERE GIVEN ROLL-CALL OR SUPERVISOR TRAINING SO THAT THE CRASH TEAM COMMANDERS ARE NOTIFIED FOR POTENTIAL CALLOUTS AND COORDINATION AND CALLS ARE ESSENTIALLY MADE BY THEM. INVESTIGATIONS ARE STILL THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF JURISDICTION, HOWEVER, ASSISTANCE FROM ANY MEMBER IS AVAILABLE TO ENSURE THOROUGH AND EXPEDIENT COMPLETION OF THE INVESTIGATION OVERALL.

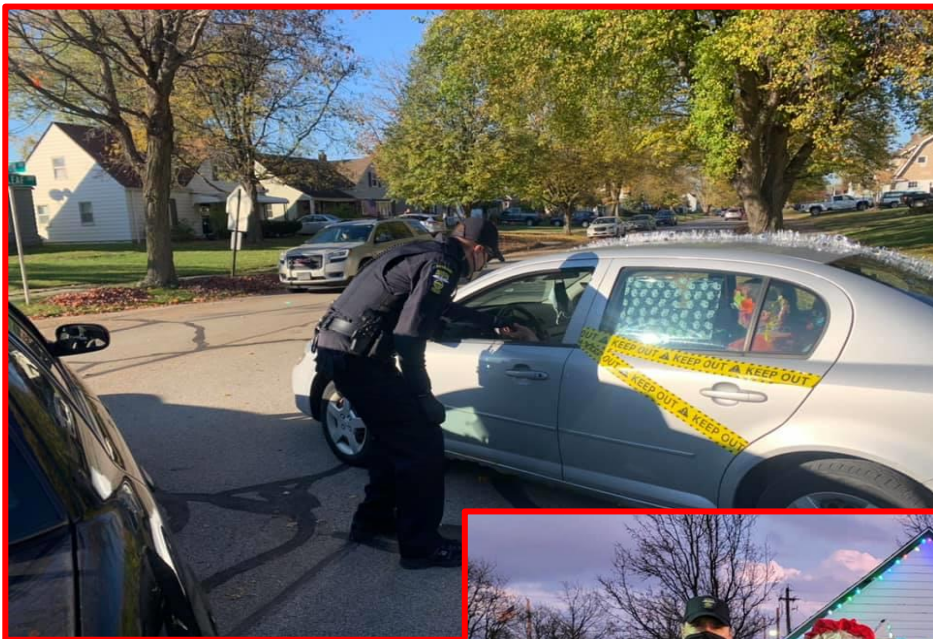

## POLICE AND CITIZENS TOGETHER



DESPITE THE PANDEMIC IN 2020, 13 OFFICERS, 2 AUXILIARY OFFICERS AND 1 CIVILIAN CLERK CONTINUED THE COMMUNITY POLICING INITIATIVES OF THE PARMA HEIGHTS POLICE 'POLICE AND CITIZENS TOGETHER' (P.A.C.T.) UNIT. THIS INITIATIVE WAS REINTEGRATED IN 2016 BY PATROL OFFICERS WHO SAW A NEED FOR MORE ENGAGEMENTS OF A PERSONAL LEVEL BETWEEN CITIZENS AND OFFICERS. MANY OF THE ACTIONS OF THESE OFFICERS ARE NOT 'LOGGED' AND ARE DONE OUT OF THE KINDNESS OF THEIR HEART IN KEEPING WITH THE DEPARTMENT'S MISSION. COUNTLESS HOURS WERE LOGGED AT EVENTS SUCH AS YOUTH GROUP MEETINGS, PARADES, AND STATION TOURS. IN 2020 THE DEPARTMENT PARTICIPATED IN VARIOUS SOCIAL DISTANCED BIRTHDAY 'DRIVE-BY' PARADES THROUGHOUT THE CITY.

IN AUGUST OF 2020, THE PARMA HEIGHTS POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS AWARDED THE OHIO ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE LAW ENFORCEMENT FOUNDATION 'AGENCY OF THE MONTH' FOR THE CONTINUED COMMUNITY POLICING INITIATIVES. THIS AWARD WAS ONLY POSSIBLE DUE TO THE COMMITMENT AND HARD WORK OF ALL 16 MEMBER OF THIS UNIT.

**SENIOR PROGRAMMING** - WORK IN CONJUNCTION WITH PARMA HEIGHTS SENIOR CENTER - SCAMS, HOME SECURITY, ETC. PRESENTATIONS ARE GIVEN. A ZOOM CALL WAS HELD DURING THE PANDEMIC TO KEEP SENIOR RESIDENTS UP TO DATE ABOUT COVID-19 RELATED SCAMS AND ANSWER ANY OTHER QUESTIONS THEY HAD.

**YOUTH GROUP** - MEET BI-WEEKLY FOR 1.5 HOURS - 2 JUNIOR LEADERS - AVERAGE OF 10-15 PARTICIPANTS PER SESSIONS - YOUTH CHOOSE THE TOPICS THAT MATTER TO THEM - ONLY POLICE SPONSORED YOUTH GROUP IN THE AREA. THIS PORTION OF THE PROGRAM HAS BEEN TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED DUE TO PANDEMIC.

**NEIGHBORHOOD ZONES** - PATROL FIELDING EMAILS, PHONE CALLS AND IN-PERSON COMPLAINTS THAT WERE HANDLED BY OFFICERS DURING THEIR NORMAL TOUR OF DUTY STEMMING FROM NEIGHBORHOOD ZONE ASSIGNMENTS.
