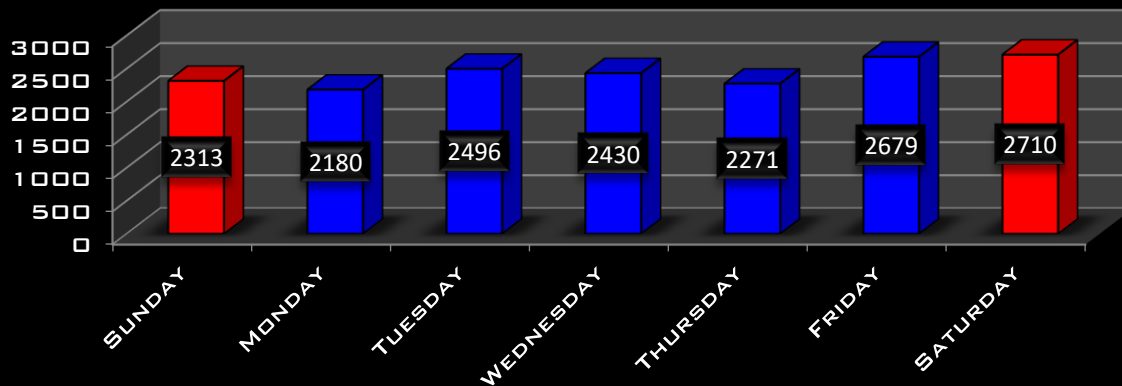

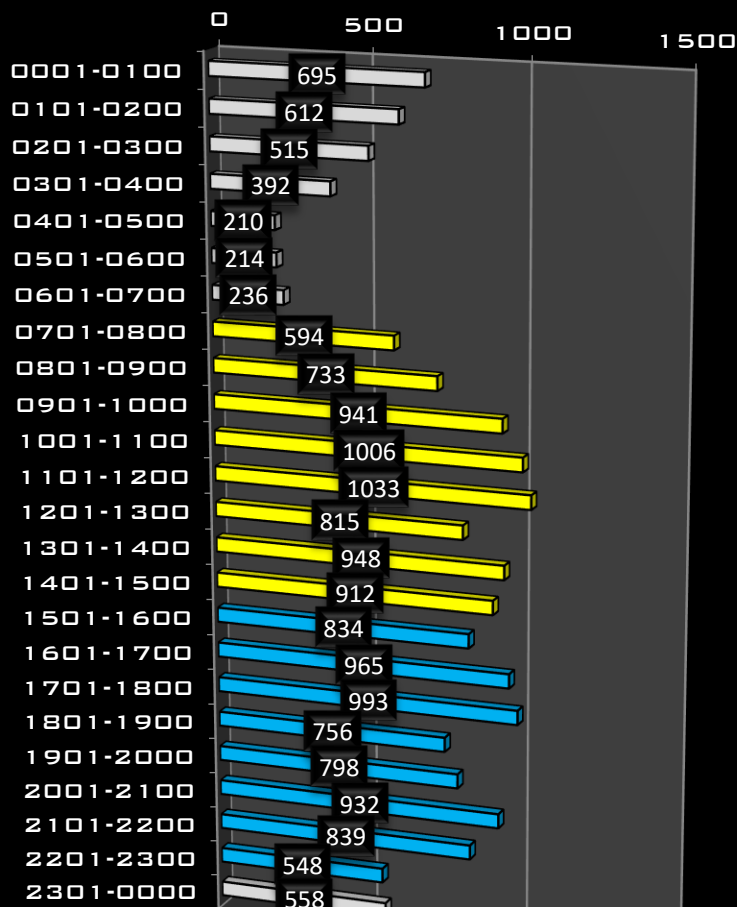

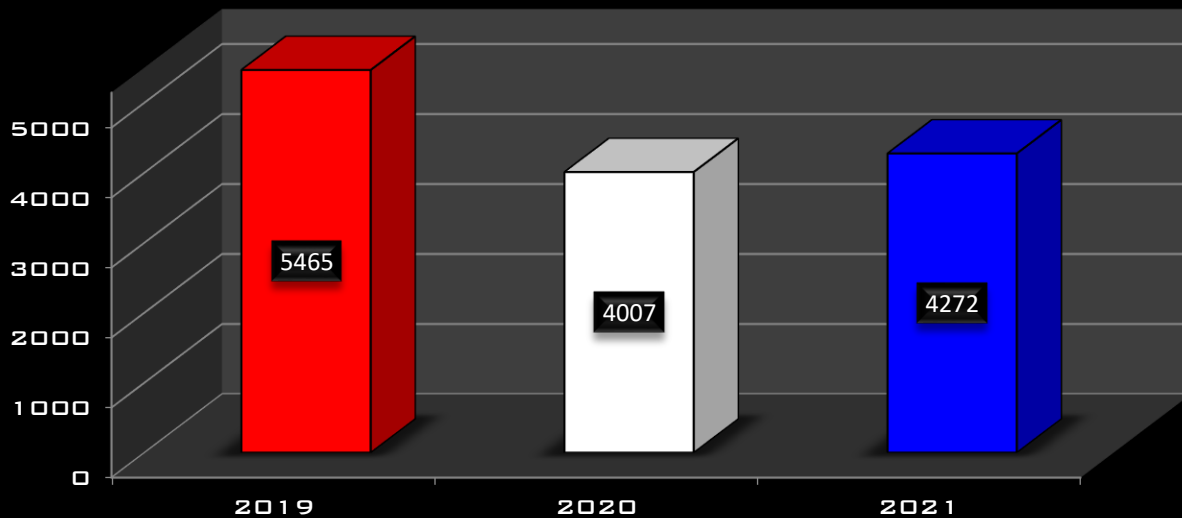

FIREARMS TRAINING UNIT



FOR THE YEAR 2021, OUR IN-HOUSE FIREARMS TRAINING PROGRAM AND THE SGT. BENNETT FIREARMS TRAINING RANGE SAW SOME CONTINUING CHANGES, UPDATES, AND IMPROVEMENTS. WE BEGAN THE FIRST QUARTER OF THE YEAR BY CONDUCTING ANNUAL OPOTA QUALIFICATIONS FOR A MAJORITY OF THE DEPARTMENT ON THE BASIC OPOTA STANDARDS IN DUTY HANDGUN AND SHOTGUN. THESE BASIC QUALIFICATIONS ARE MANDATED BY OPOTA FOR ALL POLICE DEPARTMENTS IN OHIO.

AS THE YEAR PROGRESSED, WE CONTINUED WITH ANNUAL QUALIFICATIONS AND ADDED OUR DEPARTMENT MANDATED PATROL RIFLE QUALIFICATIONS AS WELL. ALTHOUGH NOT REQUIRED BY OPOTA, WE HAVE INSTITUTED THIS AS AN ANNUAL REQUIREMENT FOR ALL OFFICERS SO THAT EACH IS FAMILIAR WITH THE SAFE OPERATION AND EMPLOYMENT OF THE PATROL RIFLE PLATFORM WHETHER THEY DEPLOY THEM OR NOT, OR IN CASE OFFICERS COME INTO CONTACT WITH PATROL RIFLES BY AN ARMED ADVERSARY, OR ANY OTHER TYPE OF CONTACT WITH THE PLATFORM.

CONTINUING THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, ADDITIONAL FIREARMS AND USE OF FORCE TRAINING FOR OUR OFFICERS WAS CONDUCTED ON A REGULAR BASIS. THIS TRAINING INCLUDED WORK ON TARGET DISCRIMINATION AND IDENTIFICATION (UTILIZING ARMED "SHOOT"/UNARMED "DON'T SHOOT" PHOTO REALISTIC TARGETS), TRANSITION DRILLS, LOW LEVEL LIGHT OPERATIONS, AND NUMEROUS ADDITIONAL SKILLSETS. THE DEPARTMENT USE OF FORCE (UOF) POLICY WAS REVIEWED AS RELATED TO USE OF FORCE AND DEADLY FORCE. OFFICERS VIEWED VIDEOS OF NATIONAL OFFICER INVOLVED INCIDENTS INVOLVING USE OF FORCE, AND REGULAR DISCUSSIONS WERE HELD ON INCIDENTS AND TACTICS FOUND IN THOSE VIDEOS AND THE GENERAL STATE OF POLICING IN THE UNITED STATES.

IN MID FEBRUARY MT2 RETURNED TO OUR FACILITY TO CONDUCT AN INSPECTION OF AN IDENTIFIED PROBLEM WITH THE RANGE BACKSTOP. DUE TO OUR USE OF THE RANGE, THE BACKSTOP BECAME BLOCKED IN LANES 1 AND 5. THIS CAUSED BACKSPASH TO PUSH BULLETS AND BULLET FRAGMENTS BACK TOWARD THE SHOOTERS IN THE RANGE, AND IS A HAZARD WITH POTENTIAL INJURY POSSIBILITIES. MT2 SENT ONE OF THEIR TECHNICIANS TO INSPECT THE BACKSTOP AND GIVE HIS PROFESSIONAL OPINION ON OUR OPTIONS. HIS RECOMMENDATION WAS A 2-4 DAY OVERHAUL OF THE RANGE BACKSTOP, WHICH WOULD INCLUDE REMOVING THE LOUVERS AND DISLODGING THE IMPACTED LEAD FROM BULLET BUILD UP. AN ESTIMATE WAS RECEIVED AND FORWARDED TO THE CHIEF FOR REVIEW.

IN EARLY JANUARY, A TRAINING PLAN WAS DISCUSSED AND WAS PUT IN PLACE FOR 2021 WITH SUPPORT OF CHIEF SCHARSCHMIDT. THIS PLAN WOULD BE TO CONDUCT HANDGUN TRAINING IN A SIMILAR FASHION TO THE RIFLE TRAINING CONDUCTED IN 2020. THIS TRAINING WOULD HAVE BEEN A ONE-DAY CLASS AND WOULD HAVE BEEN GIVEN TO ALL OFFICERS. DUE TO THE POTENTIAL TRANSITION TO SIG SAUER P320 9MM DUTY HANDGUNS, THIS SPECIFIC TRAINING WAS POSTPONED UNTIL 2022.

THE CURRENT SIG SAUER P229R FIREARMS WE FIELD WERE PURCHASED IN 2008. MOST POLICE FIREARMS HAVE A LIFESPAN OF 8-10 YEARS. WITH OUR DUTY WEAPONS AT THE 12-YEAR MARK, THE CHIEF AUTHORIZED A TEST AND EVALUATION (T&E) OF THE P320s. AFTER THOROUGH TESTING BY MEMBERS OF THE FTU, SEB, AND GENERAL PHPD MEMBERS, THE FULL-SIZE VERSION OF THE P320 WAS SELECTED AND PROPOSED TO THE CHIEF. AFTER BUDGET MEETINGS WITH CITY HALL, THE CHIEF GAVE HIS APPROVAL TO MOVE FORWARD ON THIS TRANSITION ON FEBRUARY 19, 2021.





FIREARMS TRAINING UNIT



ONGOING CONSULTATION AND DISCUSSION WITH MT2 AS WELL AS WITH THE CHIEF MADE RANGE BACKSTOP MAINTENANCE A PRIORITY. THE DECISION WAS MADE BY THE CHIEF WITH SUPPORT OF CITY HALL TO MOVE FORWARD AND HAVE MT2 RETURN AND CONDUCT INTENSE MAINTENANCE TO THE RANGE TO REMOVE AMALGAMATED LEAD FROM LANES 1 AND 5. ON 6/25/2021 A CREW FROM MT2 ARRIVED ON SITE AND REMOVED LOWER LOUVERS AND WAS ABLE TO FREE THE AMALGAMATED LEAD, AND ONCE AGAIN CLEAN THE RANGE BACKSTOP OF ALL LEAD AND BULLET FRAGMENTS. THE RANGE WAS AGAIN CLEANED OF LEAD DUST AND SANITIZED SO THAT IT IS A SAFE WORKING ENVIRONMENT FOR OUR OFFICERS. DUE TO THE ONGOING MAINTENANCE ISSUES AS THE BACKSTOP AGES, A MAINTENANCE PLAN WAS FORMALLY ADOPTED AND PUT IN PLACE BY THE FTU.

IN AUGUST, SGT. LINDH (RANGEMASTER) AND PTL. VINKLER (LEAD FIREARMS INSTRUCTOR) ATTENDED SAFARILAND'S "USE OF FORCE" INSTRUCTOR COURSE. THIS COURSE WAS HOSTED HERE AT PARMA HEIGHTS PD UTILIZING THE COMMUNITY ROOMS OF THE CASSIDY THEATER. THE SAFARILAND "USE OF FORCE" INSTRUCTOR COURSE IS THE MOST COMPREHENSIVE METHOD FOR UNDERSTANDING AND TEACHING USE OF FORCE (UOF). THIS TRAINING FAMILIARIZED ATTENDEES WITH THE PERTINENT USE OF FORCE CASE LAW AND DEMONSTRATED HOW UOF RELATES TO POLICY, TRAINING AND ACTUAL "STREET" APPLICATIONS. ALONG WITH LEARNING THE SKILLS TO TEACH USE OF FORCE, PARTICIPANTS WERE SHOWN HOW TO ASSIST IN USE OF FORCE POLICY WRITING AND HOW TO REVIEW FORCE-RELATED REPORT WRITING. THIS TRAINING TEACHES INSTRUCTOR'S SKILLS IN DEFENDING USE-OF-FORCE CASES IN THE COURTROOM.

ONGOING DISCUSSIONS ARE HELD WITHIN THE FTU THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, AND DURING DISCUSSIONS ON THE PENDING TRANSITION TO THE SIG P320S THE FTU IDENTIFIED A NEED FOR AND REQUESTED TRAINING AMMUNITION THROUGH THE CHIEF'S OFFICE. DUE TO PENDING INCREASE IN PRICING OF AMMUNITION, IT WAS DETERMINED THAT WE WOULD PURCHASE 9MM TRAINING AMMUNITION AT THE CURRENT COST AND NEED PROJECTION FOR THE NEXT SEVERAL YEARS. THE CURRENT STATE CONTRACT PRICING OF THIS AMMUNITION AS OF AUGUST 2021 IS AT 51% OFF THE RETAIL PRICE. THIS PRICING ALLOWED US TO PURCHASE DOUBLE THE AMOUNT OF TRAINING AMMUNITION FOR THE BUDGETED PRICE WHICH ONCE RECEIVED, WILL ALLOW US TO CONDUCT SUFFICIENT ADVANCED TRAINING FOR OUR OFFICERS.

SERGEANT LUZNIAK PRESENTED AND WROTE A GRANT IN WHICH WE RECEIVED MONEY TO REPLACE THE CURRENT, OUTDATED PLATE CARRIERS IN OUR PATROL CRUISERS. THESE PLATE CARRIERS ALLOW OFFICERS TO QUICKLY DON ADDED BALLISTIC PROTECTION IN THE CASE OF AN ACTIVE SHOOTER OR ARMED ADVERSARY, AND ALSO INCLUDE EXTRA AMMUNITION AS WELL AS FIRST AID SUPPLIES. THE OLDER PLATES AND CARRIERS ARE OUTDATED AND OUT OF WARRANTY, AND THE CARRIERS SHOW SIGNS OF WEAR. THE NEW PLATES ARE MUCH LIGHTER AND EASIER TO DON THAN THE CURRENT PLATE CARRIERS.

UPON BEING PROMOTED TO SERGEANT IN DECEMBER, JOHN VINKLER ASSUMED THE ROLE OF ASSISTANT RANGE SUPERVISOR. TOGETHER WITH SGT. LINDH, THE TWO WILL OVERSEE THE ADVANCED FIREARMS TRAINING THAT IS CONDUCTED BY OUR OFFICERS ON AN ONGOING BASIS. SGT. VINKLER WILL CONTINUE HIS ROLE OF OVERSEEING THE RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OVERALL FIREARMS TRAINING PLAN, BUT WILL NOW HAVE THE ADDED RESPONSIBILITY OF ENSURING AND COORDINATING ONGOING TRAINING AND ENSURING THAT THIS TRAINING IS COMPLETED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE FTU.

TRAINING REPORT



WHEN OFFICERS GRADUATE THE POLICE ACADEMY, THEIR TRAINING IS ONLY BEGINNING. TRAINING SHOULD BE A CAREER-LONG PROCESS FOR POLICE OFFICERS. TRAINING FOR THE PARMA HEIGHTS POLICE DEPARTMENT REMAINS A PRIORITY, ENSURING THAT OUR OFFICERS STAY SAFE AND PROVIDE THE BEST LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICE POSSIBLE TO EVERY CITIZEN WE ENCOUNTER.

IN 2021 TRAINING REMAINED A PANDEMIC ASSOCIATED CHALLENGE. ALTHOUGH CLASSES OPENED FOR IN-PERSON EDUCATION, WAVES OF COVID CANCELLED SOME CLASSES LAST MINUTE, LIMITED CLASS SIZE OR ELIMINATED SOME CLASSES FOR THE YEAR ALTOGETHER.

THROUGH THOSE CHALLENGES, OFFICERS AND STAFF MEMBERS NOT ONLY ATTENDED COURSES, BUT IN MANY CASES TOOK COURSES TO BECOME SPECIALIZED INSTRUCTORS TO ASSIST WITH "IN-HOUSE" TRAINING IN CERTAIN CASES. OUR OFFICERS ALSO ASSISTED IN INSTRUCTION AND PARTICIPATED A NEWLY DEVELOPED, MULTI-AGENCY TACTICAL PATROL OFFICER COURSE.

VEHICLES



CURRENTLY, THE PARMA HEIGHTS POLICE DEPARTMENT HAS 21 POLICE VEHICLES IN ITS FLEET. 11 OF THOSE VEHICLES ARE UNIFORM PATROL VEHICLES, 8 VEHICLES ARE DETECTIVE BUREAU AND ADMINISTRATION VEHICLES, 1 VEHICLE IS FOR OUR SEB (SWAT) OFFICERS, AND 1 VEHICLE IS AN AUXILIARY PATROL VEHICLE. 16 OF THE 21 VEHICLES NEED TO BE PLACED DUE TO AGE AND MILEAGE. 8 VEHICLES ARE CONSIDERED "CRITICAL" FOR REPLACEMENT. WE CURRENTLY HAVE ONLY 2 POLICE VEHICLES THAT ARE LESS THAN 5 YEARS OLD.

IN 2021, THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL APPROVED THE PURCHASE OF 5-2021 DODGE CHARGERS TO REPLACE 4 AGED PATROL VEHICLES AND 1 ADMINISTRATIVE VEHICLE. HOWEVER, DUE TO COVID, CHIP SHORTAGES, AND MANUFACTURER ISSUES, THE ORDER WAS CANCELLED BY THE MANUFACTURER LATE IN THE YEAR. THE MANUFACTURER INFORMED THE DEALERS THAT THEY COULD RESUBMIT THE CANCELLED ORDERS FOR 2022 MODELS, AND THEY WOULD HONOR 2021 PRICING. THAT ORDER WAS RESUBMITTED FOR 2022. THIS DID NOT HELP OUR VEHICLE SITUATION. WE ARE HOPING TO GET DELIVERY OF THE 2022 DODGE CHARGERS BY LATE SUMMER, EARLY FALL.

THROUGH OUR DEALER, WE WERE ABLE TO LOCATE 4 NEW 2021 FORD EXPLORER POLICE VEHICLES. THE CITY APPROVED THE PURCHASE OF THOSE VEHICLES, AND AT THIS WRITING, THEY ARE WAITING FOR EQUIPMENT TO ARRIVE FOR THEIR BUILD OUT. 3 OF THESE VEHICLES WILL REPLACE THREE PATROL VEHICLES, AND 1 WILL GO TO THE PARMA HEIGHTS FIRE DEPARTMENT TO FULFILL THEIR NEED OF A NEW ADMINISTRATIVE VEHICLE. DELIVERY OF THESE VEHICLES IS EXPECTED IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF 2022. THE CITY ALSO APPROVED THE PURCHASE OF A 2022 CHEVROLET SILVERADO 2500 HD CREW CAB PICK-UP TRUCK TO REPLACE THE 2009 FORD EXPEDITION THAT OUR SEB OFFICERS USE. THE EXPEDITION HAS FRAME ISSUES AND HAS LIMITED USE. WE HOPE TO RECEIVE THIS VEHICLE SOMETIME IN 2022.

IN 2021, OUR DETECTIVE BUREAU WAS ABLE TO ADD A 2016 DODGE CHALLENGER TO OUR DETECTIVE BUREAU FLEET. THIS WAS DONE THROUGH A CRIMINAL FORFEITURE. THIS CAR ACTUALLY REPLACES A VEHICLE WE LOST IN A CRASH AND HAD NOT BEEN REPLACED.

THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WILL CONTINUE TO REPLACE IT AGING FLEET WITH THE CONTINUED SUPPORT OF OUR MAYOR AND OUR CITY COUNCIL. WE WILL ALSO PURSUE ANY OTHER AVENUES, SUCH AS GRANTS, FORFEITURES, AND AUCTIONS OF THOSE FORFEITURES TO PURCHASE VEHICLES.

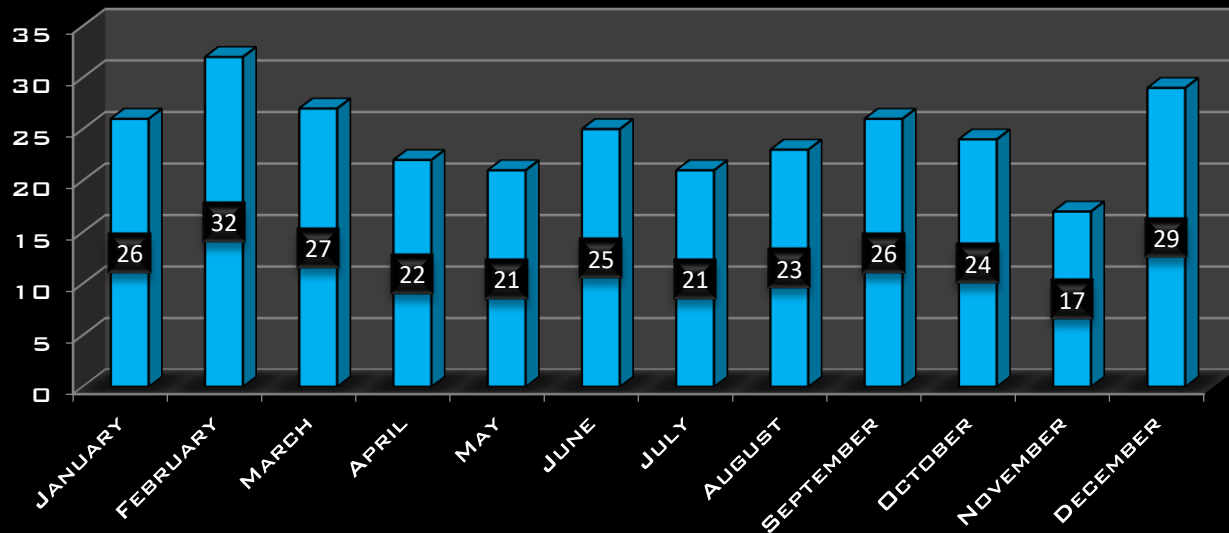




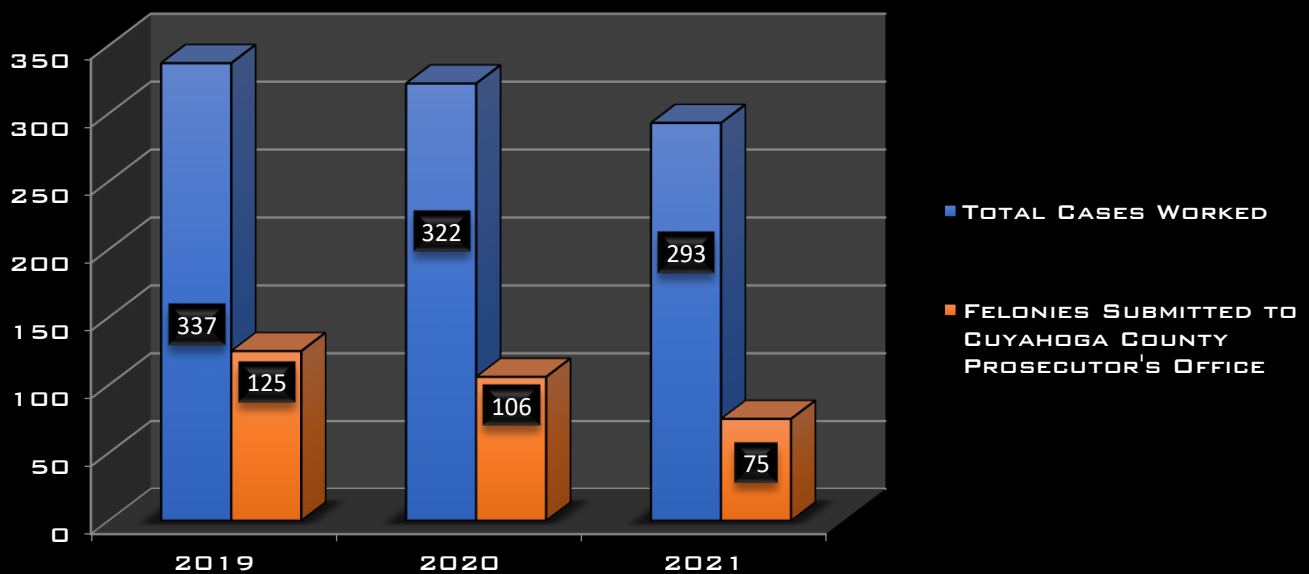

THE SEB WEST REGION S.W.A.T. TEAM RESPONDED TO 6 OF THE 11 CITIES/TOWNSHIPS WITHIN THE REGION THIS YEAR AND ASSISTED CENTRAL REGION OF SEB S.W.A.T. ON 1 CALL FOR SERVICE. WE RESPONDED TO THE CITY OF CLEVELAND AS MUTUAL-AID TO CLEVELAND'S SWAT UNIT 1 TIME TO ASSIST WITH CIVIL UNREST, AND 3 OTHER TIMES TO ASSIST WITH THE NFL DRAFT. SIX OF THE 18 CALLS FOR SERVICE, OR 33% OF THE TOTAL CALLS WERE FOR BARRICADED SUBJECTS.

FOUR CALLS, OR 22%, WERE FOR SEARCH OR ARREST WARRANT SERVICE. (TWO OF THE 4 CALLS FOR SEARCH OR ARREST WARRANT SERVICE, OR 50% OF ALL WARRANT SERVICES, EVOLVED IN TO BARRICADED SUBJECTS.)

OF THE 6 CALLS FOR BARRICADED SUBJECTS, AND FOR THE 2 ARREST WARRANT SERVICES THAT EVOLVED IN TO BARRICADE SITUATIONS (8 TOTAL BARRICADE SITUATIONS), GAS DEPLOYMENT WAS USED AS AN INTERVENTION BY THE WEST REGION ON 2 OF THE CALLS. OVERALL, 25% OF THE BARRICADE CALLS WERE RESOLVED WITH THE USE OF GAS. SEVEN OF THE 8 BARRICADE CALLS RESULTED IN ARRESTS. ONE CALL FOR A BARRICADED SUBJECT RESULTED IN THE USE OF DEADLY FORCE.

TWO CALLS, OR 13%, WERE FOR MANPOWER ISSUES RELATED TO PROTESTS.

ONE CALL, OR 6%, WAS FOR MANPOWER ISSUES RELATED TO VIP/DIGNITARY SECURITY

FIVE CALLS, OR 31%, WERE MUTUAL-AID CALLS OUTSIDE OF SEB CITIES. (THREE OF THE 5 CALLS WERE FOR THE NFL DRAFT.)

EIGHT HIGH RISK ARRESTS WERE MADE TOTAL.

FIREARMS WERE A FACTOR IN 6 CALLS.

THE THREAT OF FIREARMS, OR THE PRESENCE OR THREAT OF OTHER DEADLY WEAPONS, WERE A FACTOR IN 2 ADDITIONAL CALLS.

THE SOUTH WEST ACCIDENT GROUP ADDED THE CITY OF BROADVIEW HEIGHTS IN 2021.

SWAG IS NOW COMPRISED OF 9 CITIES IN CUYAHOGA COUNTY WITH A TOTAL OF 30 MEMBERS. AS OF DECEMBER OF 2021 THE UNIT NOW HAS 13 OFFICERS CERTIFIED IN CRASH RECONSTRUCTION, AND 17 AT LEVEL 2 OR LEVEL 3 CERTIFICATIONS LEVELS. THE UNIT ALSO HAS 2 MEMBERS CERTIFIED TO DO EDR (ELECTRONIC DATA RECORDER AKA "BLACK BOX") DOWNLOADS AND 1 MEMBER CERTIFIED TO INTERPRET THE REPORTS GENERATED FROM THE EDR DOWNLOAD. ALL CRASH REPORTS ARE PEER REVIEWED BY ANOTHER MEMBER CITY AND THE UNIT'S REPORTS HAVE BECOME UNIFORM.

2021 ALLOWED FOR TWO (2) TRAINING DATES FOR THE FULL TEAM AND AN ADDITIONAL COMPUTER TRAINING DATE FOR MEMBERS ON FARO SOFTWARE. THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 11 TEAM CALLOUTS DURING 2021. TEN OF THOSE CALL-OUTS WERE FOR CRASH SCENES AND ONE CALL-OUT WAS FOR THE DOCUMENTATION OF A SHOOTING AT DANCE.COM.

THE NEW METHOD OF CALL-OUTS HAS WORKED WELL AND REDUCED OVERALL OVERTIME PER DEPARTMENT. THERE ARE NOT ONLY BENEFITS TO THE REDUCTION OF OVERTIME AT CALL-OUTS, THERE IS INVALUABLE EXPERIENCE AND COLLABORATION BETWEEN TEAM MEMBERS GAINED WITH EACH INCIDENT. MOST DEPARTMENTS IN SWAG SEE AN AVERAGE OF 2 OR 3 CRASHES THAT WOULD NEED RECONSTRUCTION PER YEAR. USING THE REGIONAL TEAM, EACH RECONSTRUCTIONIST IS GAINING EXPERIENCE WITH TWICE THAT MANY PER YEAR.

DESPITE THE ONGOING PANDEMIC IN 2021 AND THE EFFECT IT HAS PLAYED ON IN-PERSON CONTACT, OUR DEPARTMENT CONTINUED THE COMMUNITY POLICING INITIATIVES OF THE PARMA HEIGHTS POLICE 'POLICE AND CITIZENS TOGETHER' (P.A.C.T.) DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INVESTIGATIONS

THIS WEEK GAVE A BASIC OVERVIEW OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE LAWS AND HOW OFFICERS CONDUCT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INVESTIGATIONS. THESE CALLS ARE HISTORICALLY SOME OF THE MOST DANGEROUS FOR OFFICERS TO RESPOND TO. PARTICIPANTS WERE ALSO GIVEN A QUICK GLIMPSE AT CRISIS INTERVENTION TECHNIQUES.

CRIME SCENE INVESTIGATIONS

THIS WEEK WAS A HANDS-ON APPROACH OF BASIC EVIDENCE PROCEDURES. IT INCLUDED BRING PIECES OF EVIDENCE FOR PARTICIPANTS TO ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN FINGERPRINTS FROM. PARTICIPANTS COLLECTED MOCK EVIDENCE FROM A VEHICLE.

USE OF FORCE OVERVIEW/ LAW ENFORCEMENT RESPONSE TO ACTIVE KILLER INCIDENTS

THIS WEEK INCLUDED A BASIC OVERVIEW OF A.L.I.C.E. TECHNIQUES TAUGHT BY A.L.I.C.E. CERTIFIED INSTRUCTORS.

FINANCIAL CRIMES/NARCOTICS INVESTIGATIONS

THIS WEEK WAS A BASE LEVEL INTRODUCTION TO THE VARIOUS TYPES OF ILLEGAL NARCOTICS THAT OFFICERS COME INTO CONTACT WITH WHILE WORKING PATROL. IT ALSO COVERED THE USE OF NARCAN BY PATROL OFFICERS.

VIRTRA USE OF FORCE SIMULATOR

THIS FINAL SESSION THE PARTICIPANTS GOT TO ENGAGE IN A LIFE-SIZED VIRTUAL SIMULATOR TAKING USE OF FORCE AND FIREARMS TECHNIQUES. PARTICIPANTS PLAYED THE ROLE OF POLICE OFFICERS IN THESE SCENARIOS. PARTICIPANTS WERE ALSO GIVEN A QUICK GLIMPSE OF THE PROCEDURAL JUSTICE AND HOW IT APPLIES TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.
