ORDINANCE 2022-6

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE CITY OF PARMA HEIGHTS, OHIO DURING THE PERIOD OF JANUARY 1, 2022 TO AND INCLUDING DECEMBER 31, 2022, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Parma Heights, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio:

Section 1. That to provide for the current expense and other expenditures of the City of Parma Heights, Ohio, during the period of January 1, 2022 and including December 31, 2022, the following sums set forth in Exhibit A are set aside and appropriated from the General Fund in the attached exhibit.

Section 2. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of the Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of the Council and of any of its Committees comprised of a majority of the members of the Council that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

Section 3. That the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to draw her warrants from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving the proper requisition, certificate, and voucher therefore; approved by the officers authorized by law to approve same, or an Ordinance or Resolution to make the expenditure, provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law and Ordinance.

Section 4. This Council hereby declares this Ordinance to be an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of this municipality and for the further reason that said ordinance must be enacted as soon as possible to authorize payment, and to maintain the full faith and credit of the municipality; wherefore, it shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage by Council and approved by the Mayor.
