at Greenbrier Commons has received aesthetic and equipment upgrades and will be fully operational as the warm temperatures start rolling in. The former Greenbrier indoor skating rink, more recently known as the NEO Soccer facility, has been demolished. Parma Heights is

being considered for a new library at this location, and we are working with the Cuyahoga County Public Library to make this happen for our residents.

NATHAN HALE RETENTION BASIN

We are excited to finally start the Nathan Hale retention basin project to help alleviate basement flooding for many of our residents. The cost of this project is over \$4 million, and we are grateful to our community partners for helping us make this happen. The Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District assisted Parma Heights with securing funding in the amounts of \$1 million through a Member Community Infrastructure Program Grant and up to \$1 million in Community Cost Share funds. Our County Councilman, Scott Tuma, advocated for \$1.2 million in ARPA funds for this project. We were successful in securing \$150,000 from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Recreational Trails Grant, and the remaining funding for this basin will come from storm water funds. Construction will continue through 2023, and we hope to have this project completed in early 2024. Nathan Hale Park will be closed to the public during construction.

NEW LIBRARY PLANNED FOR PARMA HEIGHTS

At the end of last year, the city was awarded grant funding through the Cuyahoga Land Bank for the demolition of the NEO Soccer facility located in Greenbrier Commons next to the water park and the Cassidy Theatre. The Cuyahoga County Public Library is in the planning stages for the construction of a new library where the NEO Soccer facility, formerly the indoor ice rink, once stood. This will be a wonderful upgrade and addition to our community for use by our residents, families and seniors.
