REPORTS FROM MAYOR AND DIRECTORS

Council President Rounds continued with the Directors Reports and began with Director Bacci....

Recreation Director Bacci: I want to thank City Council for coming and freezing outside with all of us for the Parma Heights Tree Lighting. We want to send a special thanks to the Valley Forge Choir, Vineyard Church and Troop 7187 who donated their time. We appreciate the partnerships we have. As of December 1st, the mayor is beginning her second year of the Mayor's Monarch Pledge. The three large action items she took were, proclaiming April 29th as Mayor's Monarch Day, seeding Nathan Hale with native seeds and creating a pollinator garden on Pearl Road. On December 2nd, Katelyn will host homemade Christmas Tree Ornaments with Lisa Zaremba, you can take yours home to put on your tree, the cost is \$5.00 at Cassidy Theatre. Santa Breakfast on Saturday, December 16th also at Cassidy Theatre is sold out. Katelyn and I will be taking small reservations and seeing if we can squeeze anyone else in. That concludes my report.

Council President Rounds: Thank you. Any questions or comments for Director Bacci? Councilwoman Walsh....

Councilwoman Walsh asked if next year could you look into Olde York and York. We own a piece of property there that in the spring used to be full of Daffodils, it was gorgeous. I know the Garden Club probably 50 years ago put them in. They thrive there and are beautiful.

Council President Rounds asked if there were any further questions for Director Bacci? Seeing none. Safety Director Heffernan.....

<u>Safety Director Heffernan</u>: The deer culling program update. We should be hitting our targeted number shortly. September 14th two officers from the Cleveland Academy will graduate and will begin formal training with the city and will need be certified during that time.

Council President Rounds: Any questions or comments for Director Heffernan? Councilwoman DeSouza...

Councilwoman DeSouza asked if we are close to our limit of the number of culls we are allowed, is that with any extensions or the original number allowed?

Mayor Gallo responded that we have reached our limit for budgeted overtime for deer culling, no extensions have been added. We were going to cut it off at 80 and they got it done in about 6 weeks.

Council President Rounds: Thank you. Any questions or comments for Director Heffernan? Seeing none. Service Director Sepik......

<u>Service Director Sepik</u>: Thank you, Council President. This is our last week for yard waste pick up from Republic Service, we will start again in April 2024. That has all been updated on the website. Our crews are going to begin the last pass on leaf pick up hopefully tomorrow, depending on weather.

Council President Rounds. Any questions or comments for Director Sepik? Seeing none. Finance Director Iaconis......

Finance Director Iaconis: Thank you, Council President. As I mentioned during the Caucus, I have one amendment on the 2024 Budget and that is adding a cost of \$17,000 for new radios for the Fire Department, this will be a total cost of over \$100,000, we are breaking this out over the next three years and also apply for grant funding. There will also be amendments at the next meeting for the 2023 year to wrap up the year. If anyone happens to ask you, there is a glitch on the County's web site where people go to look at their property taxes and information. It's stating that there is an outstanding balance. There is a disclaimer on the site now that says "due to system maintenance...". Please let folks know that the county is working on the site if they have any questions about balances.

Council President Rounds. Any other questions for Director Iaconis? Seeing none. Thank you. Nice to see you, Director Schneider. Mayor Gallo....

Mayor Gallo: The Senior Center served and delivered 1,016 meals over the past two weeks. This was the second highest number of meals served or delivered this year. They were closed on the 23rd and 24th of November but everyone was given the opportunity to receive meals from the Royal Redeemer Church and fortunately it was enough to make two meals out of it. Normandy High School are donating to the seniors. We won our first Volley Ball tournament held on Tuesday, November 14th. Nathan Hale project is still moving right along and hopefully will open in spring. It is still closed to the public at this time. We're working with an architect for the library at the old NEO Soccer sight and we should be selecting a General Contractor soon. December 11th is our last regularly scheduled Council meeting of the year, if anyone has anything that needs to be on the agenda, please get that in. If we need to call a special meeting we can, but we will try our best to get everything on the December 11th agenda. That completes my report, Council President.
