#### **Winter Safety Tips**

- Stay off frozen ponds. We DO NOT allow ice skating on any of our bodies of water.
- Ensure all smoke alarms are functional and replace batteries as needed.
- Ensure your chimney is cleaned and inspected annually Always use a screen to prevent sparks from escaping.
- Keep space heaters at least three feet away from anything flammable and turn them off when you leave the room or go to bed.
- Use fire-resistant materials for decorations and keep them away from heat sources.
- · Make sure your family knows how to escape in case of a fire and practice your plan regularly.

Saturday, November 8, 2025

#### Republic Services 2025 Holiday Schedule:

The holidays listed above are the only ones that will experience a one-day delay in refuse collection.

## **BUILDING** *Department*

Building permits are classified based on the type of work being done, including electrical, mechanical, structural changes, or new construction. Before applying for a permit, it is essential that your plans comply with local codes and ordinances. The Building Department must verify that your property can support the proposed changes.

A permit will be needed if you intend to make significant alterations to your home's footprint. This includes additions such as bedrooms, new rooms, most decks, garages, and sheds. Any modifications that alter the existing support system of your home—such as changes to load-bearing walls, patios, balconies, and porches—will also require a permit. Here are some additional situations where a permit is typically necessary:

# BUILDING Department (Cont.)

Fences: specific height requirements and location on your property

**New installations**: This includes windows, siding, and roofs.

Plumbing and electrical work: A permit is required to install new plumbing or electrical systems, as well as to remove existing fixtures.

Water heaters: A permit is needed to replace your water heater.

HVAC: A permit is required for the installation of heating and air conditioning systems.

As a homeowner, you are responsible for ensuring that all necessary permits are obtained for your projects, even if you hire a contractor to perform the work. Any individual or company involved in the construction or alteration of a structure or property must register with the City of Parma Heights Building Department for the current calendar year. Homeowners should not apply for building permits on behalf of their contractors. Instead, contractors are responsible for applying for and obtaining the building permits for their projects. Please note that the cost of a permit will double if it is obtained after the work has been completed.
