

ORDINANCE NO. 2025 - 94

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 660.14 ENTITLED "FENCES" OF THE
PARMA HEIGHTS CODIFIED ORDINANCES**

WHEREAS, the Council Utilities and Streets Committee is recommending the revision of Section 660.14 of the Parma Heights Codified Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, this Council desires to adopt the recommendation of its Utilities and Streets Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Parma Heights, County of Cuyahoga, and State of Ohio:

Section 1: That Section 660.14 of the Codified Ordinances as it previously existed is amended, and as amended, shall henceforth read as shown by edits set forth in Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2: This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of the Council and of any of its Committees comprised of a majority of the members of the Council that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date provided for by law.

EXHIBIT A

660.14 FENCES.

(a) Invisible fences, defined in Chapter 618, are exempt from the prohibition in this section.

~~(b)~~(a) No person shall erect or maintain any fence charged with electrical current.

~~(c)~~(b) No person shall erect or maintain a barbed wire fence which abuts or is adjacent to any public street or sidewalk. Barbed wire partition fences may be erected and maintained as provided in Ohio R.C. 971.03. This division does not prevent the placement and use of not more than two strands of barbed wire on top of a fence other than a barbed wire fence, provided such strands are not less than 48 inches from the ground.

~~(d)~~(c) Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.
