**REPORTS FROM MAYOR AND DIRECTORS**

Council President Rounds continued with Reports from Mayor and Directors, we will begin with Director Bova...

Safety Director Bova: The Fire Department, although we are almost halfway through the year has responded to 1,636 for service this year. That is a 15% increase from last year at this time. The Police Department has picked up 4 new Durango vehicles over the past couple of weeks. Captain Luzniak graduated from PELC, which is a Police Executive Leadership College.

Council President Rounds asked if there were any questions or comments for Director Bova? Seeing none. Recreation Director Sedlak...

Recreation Director Sedlak: The Commons Playground last piece of equipment is being installed today. Next steps will consist of putting in the base. Reconstruction of the tennis courts is being worked on, we ask that the public not go into that area at the moment, it will be closed off in the next few weeks. Staff are working on getting the pool ready for the season. Dive pool is being filled, chemicals are being calibrated. Soccer and flag football are in there final weeks; we will then transform over to baseball/softball and t-ball. Our Bocce Ball League has had some

cancellations where our numbers have dropped to a point we have decided not to have a league. We will maintain the courts and folks are still able to play.

Council President Rounds thanked the director and asked there were any comments or questions for Director Sedlak? Councilmembers, I would like to remind you that once softball/baseball and t-ball season gets started, we will be making ourselves available for some games to attend. We will pick a team to go to and have a back up for that team in case of rain . We will have that organized very soon. Service Director Sepik...

Service Director Sepik: Rubbish collection will be delayed at the end of May, due to the Memorial Day Holiday. The old Library demolition has begun, and a considerable amount of the building has been demolished today. The Mandalay resurfacing project is scheduled for the last week of May or first week of June. Please refer to the City's website and Facebook for road closures, timelines. I would like to make two requests beginning with the Rumpke contract. Respectfully requesting council to consider a motion to support the residential waste collection and recycling contracts with Rumpke Waste and Recycling as the lowest and best bidder. Additionally, I request a motion to include authorization for the mayor to enter into the contract with Rumpke Waste and Recycling and the release of all bid bonds to the unsuccessful bidders.

Council President Rounds made a motion that we award the contract for residential waste collection and recycling services to Rumpke Waste and Recycling as the lowest and best bidder and to release all the bid bonds to the unsuccessful bidders as well as authorize the mayor to enter into a contact; seconded by DeSouza. Are there any questions or comments? Seeing none.

Mayor Gallo: We settled with the Fire Fighters this evening. We will be discussing the contact shortly. Memorial Day Ceremony is 2 weeks away from today, 9:30 a.m. on the front lawn of the Presbyterian Church and then the parade follows immediately after. There are three regular council meetings before the summer recess.

### COMMUNICATIONS

Council President Rounds we have a Planning Commission update being provided by Councilwoman DeSouza.

Councilwoman DeSouza provided highlights from the Planning Commission meeting held May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2026. To consider a request for a lot-split by the owners of the Just Storage Facility at 7011 W. 130<sup>th</sup> Street. They are looking to sell approximately 0.6814 acre in the front parking area for a potential drive thru Dunkin Donuts. City Engineer raised numerous concerns regarding the restraints and requirements that have not been fully addressed, Assistant Director O'Malley and Chief Building Official Marty Surella also had issues they would like discussed and clarified further. Request for the lot split was approved with the contingencies of the issues, concerns and questions presented by DiFranco, Surella and O'Malley. Further discussion will ensue in the future to ensure everything is addressed.

### PUBLIC SESSION

Council President Rounds: Please state your name and address clearly for the Council Clerk to hear. Public Comment is not a discussion nor a back and forth but it's an opportunity for you to be heard in this public forum. Notes are being taken by council and the administration. You will address your comments to me as Council President. You will have 3 minutes to speak with Clerk Allen keeping the time. Is there anyone here this evening that would like to speak?

Barbara Pacino, 6400 Nelwood Road. With the blessings of the K-9 officer, the dog and the Police Chief. I don't know if any of you are aware, but when K-9 retires, he can be bought for \$1.00 and go to the owner that's been taking care of him all his years in the department. When he retires, it's not like the police or any of us, the dog gets no pension, no medical, no food he doesn't get anything. He's worked for 10 – 14 years in some cases. To be able to get medical is not that expensive. This is not something that would come out of the budget right away. We are also talking about 2 or 3 thousand per year. I would like to see council put something into place. Furthermore, there are 4 states that now have made it mandatory that all cities provide for these dogs. I congratulate Parma Heights because a dog died out in Medina from heat stroke and we have in our cruisers a protection where the windows will go down and an alarm will go off. There is no chance of losing our dog to something like that. Thank you for listening.

Mayor Gallo responded that it's a great idea, nice thought. We would have to look into any legality of taking care of something that is no longer an asset to the city. Once we sell an animal off to its owner, it's no longer considered city property. If we would also have to be in line with the States Auditors Office as well. There is a lot that goes into something like this, but we can take it into consideration. Thank you.
